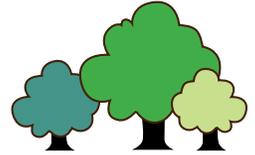

Water Quality Report, Santa Cruz County:

Snapshot Day 2019:

Thomas (sp. 7) reports that Leona Creek water was tested this summer.

The creek on both sides of Brommer Street was tested. Here are some numbers to be aware of. Most of these measurements are affected by human and animal waste.

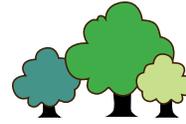
E. coli: 84 MPN p/100 mL (a large improvement since last year!) (98 across Brommer Street)
(>320 p/100mL is unhealthy)

Enterococcus: 108 MPN /mL (63 across Brommer Street)
(>110 p/100mL is unhealthy)

Coliform: 4,300 MPN p/100mL
(4,100 across Brommer Street)
(>10,000 p/100mL is unhealthy)

Save energy

Turn out the lights, turn down the heat, take public transportation or walk when possible.

Attract birds, not rodents!

Sharon (sp. 75) writes for the Sentinel about gardening and birds. On Sept. 27th she suggested feeding birds food that's not attractive to rodents such as squirrels and rats. Be sure to make your own hummingbird syrup without red dye, use nyjer seed only, and provide suet some of which has red pepper to discourage squirrels. She also mentioned the vector control specialist with the County who will come and look at your surroundings, at no charge, to see if/ where rodents can get under or into your house. He and his assistant spoke to us early this month. See the Sentinel article for more information.
